Notes from the Pastor's Pen . . .

The Holy Scriptures speak of "closed hearts" as a condition of our human condition. There are also other metaphors used: "shut," "fat," "Puffed-up," and so on. As I have pondered this recently, I looked for ways we may develop this type of heart.

- Blindness and limited vision go with a "closed" heart.
- A "closed" heart affects the mind, the reasoning process itself.
- Bondage.
- Lack of gratitude.
- Insensitive to wonder and awe.
- Forgetting God.
- A "closed" heart and exile go together.
- A "closed" heart lacks compassion.
- A "closed" heart is insensitive to injustice.

OK, then, what is the antidote? The Celtics, among others, found the answer in what they called the "Thin" places. Thin places are both physical geography and our inward being.

Thomas Merton has said that if we abandon ourselves to God and forget ourselves, we can enter a "thin" place where God shows himself everywhere and in everything. "Thin" places are places where the veil lifts for a moment, and we see God, and experience God more deeply.
